


Malahide Castle



MALAHIDE CASTLE & GARDENS

Granted to Richard Talbot in 1185, Malahide Castle remained in the Talbot family for 791 years until it was sold in 1976. The castle, with 250 acres of the demesne, is now owned by Fingal County Council. From 1948 to 1973 over 5,000 species and cultivars were added to the 20 acre gardens (pleasure grounds and 4 acre walled garden) by Milo, 7th Lord Talbot de Malahide. A noted plantsman and a recognised authority on the genus Olearia, he assembled a good collection of Australasian species through his links with Australia and had a special fondness for South American plants - interests that are still reflected in the planting today. The walled garden contains the finest part of the collection, with such exotics as the Paeonia cambessedessi and Garrya x issaquahensis, while Fingal County Council, who have restored the collection, have added many more.
