CASTLE UPTON
 Originally Castle Norton, the house dates from the late 16th century. It was purchased by Captain Henry Upton in 1625 and became Castle Upton. The Upton family lived there for the next three hundred years. During that time the house was enlarged by Robert Adam in the late 18th century and again by Edward Blore in 1837. The interior, as seen today, is largely by Blore. Adam built the stable block and a monument, the Templeton Mausoleum (NT), in 1789. The Kinahan family have owned the castle for the last forty years.
 Once surrounded by a fine demesne, many trees were felled by previous owners and subsequently buildings have been added. Ormate Victorian bedding schemes, within a balustraded area near the house, were put in to compliment the Blore house but have long-since gone.
